Town - an area with houses. More than a village but less than a city.

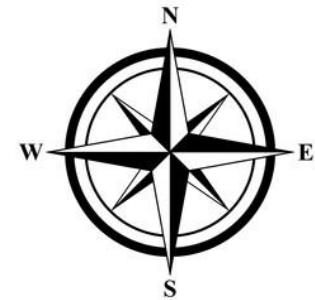
Compass - a tool used for finding direction.
