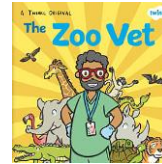

This week we have been looking at vets. We have learnt that vets help us by looking after our pets and teach us how to look after them. Our dragon is still with us and we have been thinking of ways how we can take care of him. We have kept an eye out for his family but we have worked together to keep him safe.

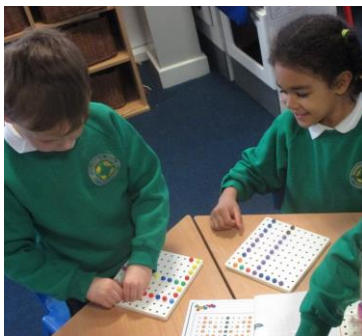


In phonics we have introduced the children to the trigraphs ear (f-ear), air (h-air) and ure (c-ure). It is important that your child understands these trigraphs are three letters that make one sound. We have introduced joining these letters as this makes them easier to remember and prepares your child for joining their writing. We have also learned the tricky word: are and all.



In maths we have been consolidating our learning and sharing what we know! The children have been investigating number by finding out what is one more and one less than a number. The children have been ordering numbers and looking at numbers bond to 5 focusing on using two smaller numbers.



The children have also been working on their fine motor skills using peg boards to create shapes, tap tap art and working together to build models out of blocks.



### Home Learning Challenge


To copy the letters ear air ure and have a go at writing these independently. Please continue to encourage your child to hold their pencil correctly as they do so.

Look carefully at the picture.

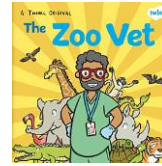
Can you find 4 flowers and 4 flowers? How many flowers altogether?
