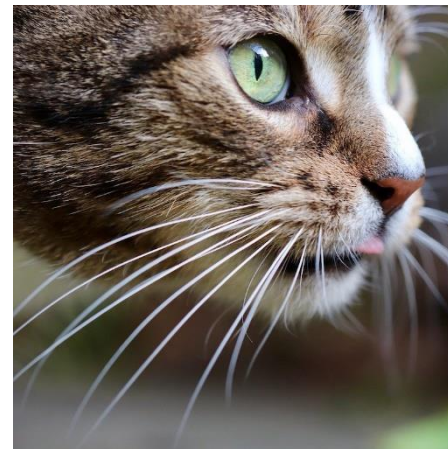

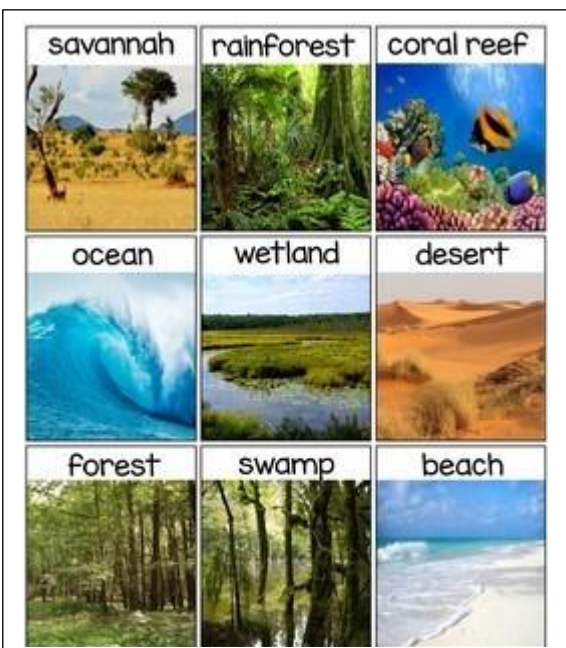

birds	Birds are warm blooded. They have feathers, wings and a beak. Most birds can fly.
mammals	Warm blooded animals with fur or hair. They give birth to live young and feed their young with their milk. Humans are mammal.
reptile	Cold blooded animals that live in water and on land. hey lay eggs on land and have lungs to breathe air. Reptiles have dry, scaly skin.
warm blooded	Animals with body temperatures that usually stay the same
cold blooded	Animals that can become hotter and colder
carnivore	Eats meat. A lion, crocodile, eagle, fox are carnivores.
herbivore	Eat plants. An elephant, deer, rabbit, cow, sheep eat plants
omnivore	Eat meat and plants. A hedgehog, badger, hen eat both
camouflage	Disguise and hide. Colours match the surrounding area to blend in
predator	An animal that hunts for its food,
